MARGARITA BELILOVSKAYA "LEFT FIELD"





Rho Chi is the national scholastic honor society of pharmacy with the objective of promoting a high standard of conduct and character. In addition, Rho Chi recognizes academic excellence and fosters a fellowship among its members. Entree into Rho Chi is an honor for individuals pursuing pharmacy because it reflects excellence, passion, and devotion to the field. As members of this honor society, individuals are not only recognized as intellectual leaders, but also as devout advocates seeking to further advance the profession of pharmacy. The colors assigned to Rho Chi are purple, representing royalty and honor, and white which reflects the loyalty of its members to the pharmaceutical sciences. Here at the California Northstate University, College of Pharmacy, we are the 116th Chapter designated as the Delta Upsilon Chapter as of 2014. To be eligible for the collegiate membership students must:

- Be enrolled full-time in a professional pharmacy program.
- Have completed no less than one-half of the required professional didactic course work as defined for their degree.
- Rank in the highest 20 percentile of the class and attained a minimum professional grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
